

# Lanier Auxiliary Racing Committee Fall 2016 and Winter 2017 Series

## Notice of Regatta October 06, 2016

### Rules

The races will be governed by the "rules" as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016 (RRS). The Series is designated Category A and is hosted by Atlanta Inland Sailing Club, Barefoot Sailing Club, Lake Lanier Sailing Club, Southern Sailing Club and University Yacht Club. These series are organized by the Lanier Auxiliary Racing Committee (LARC).

### Entries

Eligible skippers are entered by being a member of good standing of any hosting authority; the Atlanta Inland Sailing Club, Barefoot Sailing Club, Lake Lanier Sailing Club, Southern Sailing Club or the University Yacht Club. Skippers should complete a Fall/Winter registration form at one of the skipper's meetings. For this series boats must be as follows: a self-righting monohull 19.5 feet LOA or above, or a multihull that has sleeping accommodations and holds a current Lake Lanier Performance Handicap Racing Fleet (LLPHRF) Handicap Certificate.

### Registration

Competitors may register by filling out a form at a skippers' meeting.

### Schedule of Races

Skipper's meetings are scheduled to be held, but are subject to change, at 11 a.m. prior to each race outside Aqualand Ship's Store for the SSC, AISC and BFSC hosted events.

Skippers meeting for the UYC hosted will be at UYC in the pavilion, same time.

Skippers meeting for the LLSC hosted event will be at the LLSC clubhouse, same time

Attendance is recommended to get RC instructions, start times (staggered start) and after-race party location. *Come to the skipper's meeting to find extra crew or if you want to crew, obtain fleet flags or sailing instructions, or register.*

Races are scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. (warning at 12:55 p.m.). Races are scheduled to start in the vicinity of "X" mark (Island 18), but may be moved elsewhere at the discretion of the Race Committee.

After each race, the club handling race management for the day will host a party. Very light hors d'oeuvres may be served. ***After-race festivities are BYOB.*** For races hosted by UYC, in lieu of a post-race party, a hot breakfast will be served at 10am prior to the 11am skipper's meeting in the UYC Carswell Pavilion.

The races hosted by Atlanta Inland Sailing Club, Lake Lanier Sailing Club and University Yacht Club will be started using RRS 26. Those races hosted by Barefoot Sailing Club and Southern Sailing Club will be started using staggered starts. NOTE: For the BSC and SSC races, the course and start times shall be established at the skippers' meetings.

## Classes and Flags:

Class Flags may be designated by the following Number Pennants:

Fleet 1 Sport will consist of all planing hull Asymmetrical sport boats.

Fleet 2 and 3 will include non-spin boats with a 15 seconds per mile adjustment.

Any boats which don't specifically fall into one category will have their placement decided by the flag officers of LARC.

The LLPHRF rating assigned to each fleet may be re-assigned at the skipper's meeting of the first race in each series.

## Racing Area

The racing area will be in Flowery Branch Bay, Chattahoochee Bay, or as shown in the attached Lake Lanier map.

## The Course

Courses will be designated by the race committee before each race using permanent Corps, Lake Lanier Sailing Club marks, or temporary marks.

## Scoring

The time-on-distance method of PHRF handicapping will be used. The Low Point scoring system, RRS rule A2, will apply, with the exception that the suggested wording from RRS rule AS will replace the second paragraph of RRS rule A2.2 as follows: Boats not so scored that came to the starting area will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of all boats that came to the starting area. Boats that did not come to the starting area will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats entered in the series.

## Trophies

Trophies will be awarded for each series, for three boats that completed at least 50 percent of the races.

A Club Championship Trophy will be awarded according to the following rules:

At registration the skipper of each boat shall declare the club under whose burgee they will be sailing in the LARC Fall and Winter series. Each skipper must be a member in good standing of that club. The registered club affiliation cannot be changed throughout the LARC Fall and Winter series.

The scoring method to determine the club championship result in the combined series is as follows:

Boats ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each fleet in each race will accrue 3 points, 2 points and 1 point respectively for their club. If fewer than 3 boats compete in any race, only those boats scored will accrue points towards the club championship.

Race committee points awarded to the participating member for race committee duty are exempted from the Club Championship Trophy scoring.

At the end of the Fall and Winter series, the points awarded to each club for each race will be totaled. The Fall and Winter series championship will be awarded to the club with the highest points total at the end of the LARC series.

A trophy will be awarded to the winning club.
